Build Your Own Kazoo

Materials: 1 large rubber band, 2 small rubber bands, 2 straw pieces, tongue depressors, decorative tape

Follow along to this song with a video at <https://tinyurl.com/BuzzwordKazoo>

Step 1: Lay the large rubber band over one tongue depressor from end to end.

Step 2: Take one straw piece and place it near the end of the tongue depressor under the rubber band.

Step 3: Place the 2nd tongue depressor on top of the one with the straw. Use the small rubber band to secure them together at the end. It should look like an alligator mouth!

Step 4: Take the second straw piece and put it at the other end (from the straw), in between the tongue depressors. It will not go under the large rubber band. Secure the end with the second small rubber band. Ta-da: you have a kazoo!

Step 5: Use the tape to decorate your kazoo. Make sure to only decorate on top of the tongue depressors, because if you tape around the depressors, your kazoo won't make any sound!

Step 6: Blow into your kazoo to make a buzzing sound

Step 7: Explore how you can make short and long sounds by blowing longer and shorter. You can also make louder and softer sounds by blowing forcefully and then more lightly.

Step 8: Make a pattern with short and long sounds, with loud and soft sounds, or a combination of both

Step 9: Practice your pattern.

Wow, you've created your own song using the sound of an instrument!

Body Drums & Hand Music

Materials: Body, shaker egg, kazoo

Let's do creative movements that make a sound, then we'll make a beat/rhythm with your body drums and hand music. Feel free to include every member of your household or just two family members! We will use our beats/rhythms to keep time. We'll use our body drums and hand music beats to make a Body Drum Band! We are learning to keep a steady beat that promotes good math skills and uses both sides of the brain. It is joyful to play music together!

Let's use parts of our body to make sounds:

- Step 1:** Clap your hands.
- Step 2:** Stomp your feet.
- Step 3:** Pop your fingers.
- Step 4:** Carefully slap your shoulder.
- Step 5:** Carefully slap your thigh.
- Step 6:** Carefully cross your arms and slap them together.
- Step 7:** Rub your hands together lightly.




Who Are We?
